#### Transcript

I'll end by simply saying that I think at this moment in time that we find ourselves in the relative peace and security of a campus in the United States of America, it seems to me that the true spirit of entrepreneurship is desperately needed at a time when in the rest of the world there is hardly the kind of security that we have sitting here right now at this moment. There is hardly a sense of being at ease. We are a world at war. We are at a place in our history where there is I believe our very civilization is under attack, whether that is symbolized for us in the destruction of ancient antiquities in a place like Baghdad which is not just a part of Iraqi civilization; it's a part of our shared human civilization. I think the moment for us to think as entrepreneurs to be willing to immerse yourself in a process to make change that is inclusive and that understands that we are part of one larger family, a global community in the truest sense of that word is something that we are not only required to do; it is something we are truly obligated to do. Perhaps in the spirit of Passover, I will end with one of my favorite quotes and what I hold on to these days, which is a quote from the Talmud which is a Jewish book of wisdom. It says do not be daunted by the enormity of the world's greed. Do justly now. Walk humbly now. Love mercy now.
