The major thing in this company is we have, as I said, these four very different programs, and how are we gonna keep people talking together? Actually, Maurice and Mike were great about talking about how do we do this, and Julia and Mike came up with this, we're called Octave, which is a, you know, musical term, they call it orchestra, so every other week, we have an orchestra meeting, where we see how we can work in concert, and we talk about what everybody's doing, so we're trying to..
